



Good morning, Church family,

I have to start off by saying — I love our church! I love being part of a vibrant community of Believers who treasure the Truth of God's Word. We have something special here at Winns, and the devil doesn't like it a bit either! I have picked up on murmurings and it is troubling to me. We must do all we can to aid in the unity of the church (Body of Christ). We must speak truth in love. We need to be praying earnestly for ourselves, others, and our families. We have to guard our hearts and tongues so as to not accidentally trespass into gossip and backbiting. What is considered "Gossip" — if you have a problem with someone and you talk to anybody else about it; or repeating things you "heard" is another example; Talking about anyone in a way that would make others think less of them; Talking about people with them not present unless you are praising them, etc.

There is a biblical way to handle these situations, and yes, it is very important that we do handle every situation so as to guard against bitterness, but we must operate exactly how God commanded us to. When you have something that is bothering you – God wants you to go to the person directly so you can verify what you heard instead of talking to others about it. I know it's easy to get caught up in the moment and you want to feel supported in whatever the situation is, but going to others that are not part of the equation actually harms the unity of the body. Matthew 18 lays out very simply how we should conduct ourselves in these manners:

Matthew 18:15-17 NKJV

(15) "Moreover, if your brother sins against you, **go, and tell him about his fault between you and him alone**. If he hears you, you have gained your brother. (16) But if he will not hear, take with you one or two more, that 'BY THE MOUTH OF TWO OR THREE WITNESSES EVERY WORD MAY BE ESTABLISHED.' (17) And if he refuses to hear them, tell it to the church. But if he refuses even to hear the church, let him be to you like a heathen and a tax collector.

When you talk to others instead of directly handling the situation in leads to disunity, feelings of being hurt, distrust, anger, etc. These are things that our Father does not want for us! But the devil certainly does! Be on guard. Search your heart and make sure you are always walking in the Truth.


